The Gazette Hillingdon Half Marathon

The 7th Hillingdon Half Marathon started from Uxbridge on the morning of Sunday 18th of March. The Milo's team, comprising Mike Sumpter, Rod Parker, Ian Jebson and myself, took our positions along with some 1700 other runners at the start. The race was due to begin at 0930, but the start was delayed by 5 minutes as the eager field were herded back behind the starting line. This year the race was held over a new course; the old route being considered too dangerous following major changes to the road system in the south of the Borough. The race started with a 2 mile circuit of North Uxbridge, we then climbed Hillingdon Hill and headed up Long Lane to North Hillingdon, where water and sponges provided welcome relief from the unusually hot March weather. The route then followed Hercies Road back to Uxbridge town centre, and the second half of the race followed part of the old course through Yeiwsley and Hillingdon before returning to Uxbridge High Street for the finish.

The event was well spectated over the entire course, and the Police and race marshalls ensured that it was safe and enjoyable.

The race was won by Tom Maher of London Irish AC with a time of 1:06:46 and the first lady home was Sally White of Thames AC with a time of 1:25:43.

Ian Jebson was the first Milo home with a time of 1:26:46, followed by myself at 1:32:37, next was Mike Sumpter at 1:39:37 and Rod Parker at 1:42:59. The Milo's team finished in 14th place, and I am sure that by fielding a stronger team next year this result can be improved upon.

Cross Country Report

The first cross-country of the New Year was against the Metropolitan Police at Orpington on a wet and windy day. Steve Finch came in first for Milos with Keith Henderson storming in second to show that marathon training pays off. Unfortunately the course markings left something to be desired. At least two Milos took a wrong turning and had to backtrack, losing valuable places in the process, and it is not clear that all competitors actually ran the same course.

The next week saw a new fixture with Milos competing in Chiltern Running Club's Inter-Club race at Amersham. The course was demanding and, in places, positively hairy! Steve Finch was first Milo home again, followed by Damian Macay, on his first outing for the club, and then Bill Reilly.

The Bank of England fixture at Richmond Park attracted only half a dozen Milos of whom Gordon Howard was the first home. Our next fixture was also against the Bank. This time we fielded 11 runners with Keith Henderson the leading Milo for the first time. We joined the Veterans AC fixture against Thames Hare and Hounds in February on Wimbledon Common. Milos came in second as a team with Tim Jones winning the race and Gary Adams the next Milo home.

The last fixture of the season was against Ranalagh where Gary Adams was the first of ten Milos to finish, including John Gilroy in his first race since Nos Galan.




