Frankfurt marathon

THE MILOCARIANS, the athletic team of the three 'Services' was represented in the Frankfurt International Marathon on Sunday 29 Oct.

On this occasion the team selected consisted of nine RAF runners and one runner from the USAF base at Greenham Common.

The team enjoyed the hospitality of Lindsay Air Station at Wiesbaden during their stay in Germany.

Over 9000 runners toed the line and the race started in favourable weather conditions. Unfortunately these conditions changed drastically after about an hour. The breeze turned to a strong wind, the drizzle turned to steady rain and there was a severe drop in temperature.

Matters arising from the previous minutes

2. The Chairman stated that the previous minutes had been published in Milonews No.11 and as there were no matters arising from them, it was proposed that the previous minutes be accepted as a true record.

Chairmans Review

3. Welcome to you all, especially our president who I am delighted to see in his usual robust good health, and thank you for attending. I really have little to add to my commments in the first of Mike sumpter's MILONEWS. only that Mike has settled in well and Frank Boland is continuing to do stirling work as the Cross Country Secretary. Support in numbers for our meetings continues to give satisfaction and it is nice to see Milos coming near the front again. I have been informed that the Duke of Edinburgh is our patron, a fact which lay fallow for some 27 years. I have updated the palace and we propose to keep him informed of our activities on an annual or bi-annual basis. Before getting down to business, I thank General Sir Charles for using his influence to arrange this venue for us.

Financial Report

4. The Treasurer circulated copies of the audited and approved Balance Sheet. He reported that the Club's finances were still healthy and members are encouraged to claim travelling expenses. It was agreed that the rate should remain at 6p per mile.

Mr John Gilroy proposed that the accounts be accepted as a true record of the Club's financial position.

Hon Secretarys' Report

5. The Secretary reported that he was still trying to find his feet as secretary and there was little to report. Issue No 12 of Milonews was produced in early October, but was not fully distributed till mid November whilst waiting for confirmation of the AGM location etc. He informed the meeting that Milonews costs about 25 per edition to produce and distribute (120 copies). The next edition is planned for mid January 1991.

Cross Country Secretarys' Report

- 6. The Cross Country Secretary reported that fixture attendence had been quite good. There has been between 13 and 22 runners at the fixtures so far. Joining the Chiltern League had increased the number of fixtures by 5, but one or two have clashed with our traditional fixtures like the Ranalagh 3.9 mile race. Members are encouraged to make maximum effort to attend these league fixtures to make joining the league worthwhile. He advised the meeting of a new league fixture for the 12th January 1991 and of the change in the Bank of England fixture from the 26th January 1991 to a date, not yet fixed Feb 91? Further fixtures with Thames Hare and Hounds and British Airways were still a possibility.
- 7. It was agreed that the Sandhurst fixture, our 'home' fixture should return to its usual date, the second saturday in October, next season. The possibility of the club entering a team in the Southern and National Cross Country Championships would be looked at for next year.

The 'Bruggen 10' was thought to be a suitable venue. Gary Adams undertook to contact 13 Signal Regiment to see if accommadation could be found for the fixture, before any final plans could be made.
