The Milocarians opened their 1991/92 cross-country season on 5th Oct 91 by hosting the Terry Lewins Trophy race at Sandhurst. Despite dank, drizzly weather 8 clubs turned out over 120 runners on a demanding 5.5 mile course.

Ranalagh, last year's winners, were obviously determined to hang on to the cup and produced a team of remarkable strength and depth. Their 'A' team ran away with the event, taking 1,2 and 3 and bringing their 6 scoring runners back within the first 12 finishers overall; it was a magnificent display of class running.

The rest of the field scrapped among themselves in the mud and rain with the Metropolitan Police just snatching the 2nd team placing from British Airways. The Police packed well, in the 30s, to give themselves the edge. Thames Hare and Hounds held off the Milocarians to take 4th and it was an indication of Ranalagh's depth of talent that their 'B' team was only 3 points away from wresting 5th place from the Milocarians.

There were very encouraging performances from the 22 Milos who took part that augur well for the rest of the season.

#### Met Police Catch Milocarians in Bank of England Swoop

The Milocarians' mass raid on the Bank of England's premises at Roehampton, on 25 jan 92, was foiled by an elite flying squad from the Metropolitan Police cross country team.

The gang leader had rounded up 22 runners, including first offenders and the usual old lags, for the 4 - sided match and was confident of a good haul of top placings, but the men from the Met had been tipped off about the Milos' recent form.

The policemen put an armlock on the leading positions - capuring 7 of the first 11 - and only Zacharides and Gregory managed to wriggle free to make off with 5th and 6th places for the Milocarians. Further down the field there were fewer policemen to arrest the Milos' progress and they were able to gang up on the

bankers and the Orion team and pinch second place.
