Apologies for Absence

1. The following apologies were received:

General Sir Charles Harington Doug Cowie Norman Niblock Paul Lawrence

Matters arising from the previous minutes.

2. The minutes were published in Milonews 13 and circulated at the meeting. There were no matters arising apart from the Sandhurst fixture which was now back, almost, in its right position as the first fixture of the season at the begining of October.

The minutes were proposed, seconded and passed unanimously as a true record.

Chairman's Review

3. The Chairman welcomed everybody to meeting and thanked all for such a large turnout, especially those who had travelled long way. He had little to add to what he had already said in the last Milonews, but encouraged everyone to make maximum effort to attend the Chiltern League fixtures as we needed at least 10 runners to acheive anything. The Chairman thanked the members of the committee for their hard work and welcomed Neil Wood, the new Cross Country Secretary and thanked him for the new season's full fixture list. In his absence, Frank Boland was thanked for all his sterling work.

Committee members

4. The Chairman brought this item forwarded and told the meeting that although the committe were willing to carry on, all position were by election and if there were any volunteers for any of the posts they would be welcomed. The meeting offereed no volunteers and the committee were voted, unanimously, into post for another year.

Financial Report

5. The Treasurer circulated copies of the audited and approved Balance Sheet. It showed that although the Club's finances were very healthy, expediture had increased due to postal costs and more members attending and claiming expenses for the various fixtures. The question of obtaining the maximum interest on the Club's savings was raised again, but it was felt that unless someone could "advise otherwise" that the current investments were acheiving the best return available whilst being secure and befitting the Club's charitable status. A copy of the financial statement is attached.

Eric Thomas proposed that the acounts be accepted as a true record of the Club's financial position. It was seconded by Neil Wood and carried unanimously.

Hon Secretary's Report

6. The Secretary thanked Neil Wood for the acquisition of an almost brand new lockable filing cabinet and reported that he was in the process of filing current and archive material. New ablums to hold archive photographs etc had still to be purchased and brought up to date. A request for artricles for the Milonews was made yet again in order to produce Milonews more often. The Secretary would like to hear of all races that members take part in and how they get on. A new members directory was in the planning stage but the Secretary was still awaiting a list of members paying by standing order.
